LWVSD PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES, 5/31/08

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 1. Number of Directors.

The authorized number of Directors shall be an odd number up to twenty-three (23) consisting of up to nine (9) elected Officers of LWVSD, eight (8) elected Directors and not more than six (6) appointed Directors, ~~until changed by amendment of the Articles or by a Bylaw.~~

Rationale: It is unnecessary.

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 2. Selection of Directors.

Of the total number of Directors other than Officers provided for in Section 1 of this Article, four (4) shall be elected by a majority of Members eligible to vote at the Annual Meeting of Members to serve a term of two years and shall take office on July 1 of that year. The other four (4) Directors shall be elected ~~on~~ in alternate years for two (2) year terms. The Appointed Directors, to serve a term of one year, shall be ~~selected~~ nominated by the incoming President on an "as-needed basis" and confirmed by a majority of the ~~incoming~~ elected Directors ~~to serve a term of one year.~~

Rationale: Without this change, it implies that only new directors can vote.

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 5. Vacancies, Second paragraph.

Vacancies on the Board shall be filled in the same manner as the director (s) whose office is vacant was selected, provided that vacancies to be filled by election may be filled by a majority of the remaining directors, ~~although~~ even though less than a quorum, or by a sole remaining director. Each director so selected shall hold office until the expiration of the term of the replaced director.

Rationale: Although LWVSD copied the bylaw wording of the State League, at their request, their wording is unclear without this small change.

Third paragraph

A vacancy may be deemed to exist when a Director is absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board without prior notification to the President or other Board Directors ~~excuse from the President~~. The Director shall be reminded in writing of this Article IV, section 5, by the Secretary following the second unexcused absence.

Rationale: Broadens notification.

Fourth paragraph

Any Officer or Director may be removed from office for just cause by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Directors then in office, at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors. Immediately following removal for cause the office becomes vacant.

Rationale: Just cause is widely understood to mean when an officer or director has been guilty of serious misconduct, habitual neglect of duty, incompetence, or conduct incompatible with his or her duties.

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 7. Special Meetings, 2nd and 3rd paragraphs.

Special meetings of the Board shall be held upon four (4) days notice by first-class mail or forty-eight (48) hours notice given personally or by telephone, ~~telegraph, telex~~ email, fax, or other similar means of communication.

Oral notice shall be deemed to have been given at the time it is communicated, in person or by telephone ~~or wireless~~ to the recipient or to a person at the office of the recipient who the person giving the notice has reason to believe will promptly communicate to the receiver.

Rationale: This wording brings the language up to date.

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 15b Budget Committee Duties

The Budget Committee shall prepare an annual budget for LWVSD and submit it to the Board at least ~~three~~ (two) months prior to the Annual Meeting.

Rationale: Since the Board meets monthly, two months is enough time.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS. Section 1 Enumeration and Election of Officers.

The officers of LWVSD shall be a President, a first Vice-President, up to four (4) other Vice Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer. ~~They shall be elected as directors and designated as Officers by the Board as provided for in Article IV, Section 2.~~

Rationale: LWVC recommended this change. Each person nominated to the Board is chosen with a specific portfolio in mind.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS. Section 2 The President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors unless the President designates someone else to preside instead. In the absence or disability of the Treasurer, the President may sign or endorse checks, drafts, and notes. The President shall be ex-officio a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee and shall have such usual powers of supervision and management as may pertain to the office of President and perform such other duties as may be designated by the Board. The President shall promptly inform the Board of actions and statements made by the President in the name of the organization.

Rationale: Improves communication and makes the Board members aware of when action is taken.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS. Section 5. Treasurer

New paragraph: The financial records of the organization shall be reviewed every two years or, at the discretion of the Board, annually at the close of the fiscal year. The financial records shall be reviewed, whenever the individual holding the office of treasurer is changed. The board shall determine how the financial review will be conducted.

Rationale: LWVC recommended that we add to our bylaws how and when financial reviews will be done.

ARTICLE VIII. FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION. Section 5c. Report on Transactions with Interested Persons.

5a. Within 120 days of the end of the corporation's fiscal year, the Board shall send to the Members a report on any transaction in which the corporation, its parent or subsidiary was a party and in which either of the following had a direct or indirect material financial interest:

1. any director or officer of LWVSD, or its parent or subsidiary.
2. any holder of more than ten percent (10%) of the voting power of LWVSD or its parent or subsidiary.

5b. The report shall briefly describe:

1. Any covered transaction during the previous fiscal year involving more than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000), or which was one of a number of covered transactions in which the same interested person had a direct or indirect material financial interest, and which transactions in the aggregate involved more than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000).
2. The names of the interested persons involved in such transactions, stating such person's relationship to the corporation, the nature of such person's interest in the transaction, and, where practicable, the amount of such interest; provided, that in the case of a transaction with a partnership of which such person is a partner, only the interest of the partnership need be stated.

5c. No such report need be sent if no transactions of the type occurred during the fiscal year. Instead, a statement that there were no covered transactions or aggregate of transactions with interested persons involving more than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) which fall within the definition of Article VIII, Section 5b shall be added to the Fiscal Report.

Rationale: The proposed statement would be consistent with the intent of the section immediately preceding Section 5 (Section 4e). Under 4e, if there is no report of independent accountants, then an authorized officer certifies that the Fiscal Report was prepared without audit.

ARTICLE VIII. FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION. Section 6. Distribution of Funds on Dissolution.

In the event of a dissolution for any cause of LWVSD, all monies and securities which may at the time be owned by or under the absolute control of LWVSD shall be paid to LWVC, after payment of any outstanding PMP payments to the ILO, LWVC, and LWVUS. All other property of whatsoever nature, whether real, personal, or mixed which may at the time be owned by or under the control of LWVSD shall be disposed of by any officer or employee of the organization having possession of same to such person, organization, or corporation, for such public, charitable, or educational uses and purposes as may be designated by the Board.

Rationale: Recommended by LWVC. Before sending the remaining money to LWVC, the LWVSD should pay its debts.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS AND VOTING RIGHTS. Section 2. Annual Meeting.

An Annual Meeting shall be held between March 15 and June 15 (30); the exact date to be determined by the Board.

Rationale: Sometimes, there are so many League conventions that it is hard to find a time to hold our Annual Meeting on a Saturday. Thus the bylaws committee recommends extending the dates till the end of the fiscal year.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS AND VOTING RIGHTS. Section 5. Notice of Annual Meeting.

Written notice of each Annual Meeting shall be given not less than ~~ten (10)~~ thirty (30) days ~~nor more than ninety (90) days~~ before the date of the Annual Meeting to each Member (.) ~~provided, however, that if notice is given by mail, and the notice is not mailed by first class, registered, or certified mail, the notice shall be given not less than twenty (20) days before the Annual Meeting.~~ Such notice shall state the place, date, and hour of the Annual Meeting and those matters which the Board, at the time of the mailing of the notice, intends to present for such action. ~~The notice shall also include the names of all those who are nominees for officers or directors at the time the notice is sent.~~

Rationale: Updating of communication. There are several things that should be in the notice (nominations, budget, program), but only one is listed here. They are all placed in other appropriate sections of these bylaws, so the bylaws committee recommends removing a duplication here.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS AND VOTING RIGHTS. Section 6. Notice of Special Meetings.

Special meetings of Members may be called at any time by the Board, ~~the Chairman of the Board,~~ the President, or upon written request made by not less than 5 percent of the members. Upon request in writing to ~~the Chairman of the Board,~~ the President, any Vice President, or the Secretary by any group of Members representing not less than five (5%) percent of all Members, the officer forthwith shall cause notice to be given to the Members entitled to vote that a meeting will be held at a time fixed by the Board, not less than 35 nor more than 90 days after the receipt of the request....

Rationale: LWVSD does not have a Chairman of the Board; it's the President. LWVC recommended this deletion.

ARTICLE XI. PROGRAM. Section 3e. Action by the Annual Meeting.

Changes in the Program, in case of altered conditions, may be made provided that: ~~(1) information concerning the proposed changes has been sent to all Members at least two weeks prior to a general membership meeting at which the change is to be discussed and (2) final action by the membership is taken at a succeeding meeting.~~ (1) Written notice stating place, date, hour, and business to be transacted had been mailed to all members at least two weeks prior to a general meeting at which the change is to be discussed and consensus taken; (2) the consensus as called for in the written notice is taken by the membership at the scheduled meeting; (3) two-thirds of those members of the Board present and voting at a subsequent Board meeting adopt the change determined by the consensus of the membership.

Rationale: Recommended by LWVC. This rewording changes the process so that it is completed in one general meeting of the membership, not two. It is unlikely that the same people would come to two meetings. Plenty of notice is given for member input in this recommended process.

ARTICLE XI. PROGRAM. Section 4 Member Action.

Members may act in the name of LWVSD only when authorized to do so by the ~~proper board of directors.~~ President, with prompt notification to the Board, or by the Board ~~They~~ Members may

act only in conformity with, and not contrary to, a position taken by either the LWVSD, LWVC, LWVUS and or the ILO.

Rationale: State League bylaws require authorization only from the board. But this alternative could help guard against misuse or non-responsiveness by a president by keeping the board in the loop.

ARTICLE XIV. AMENDMENTS. Section 1.b.

A Bylaws Committee composed of two directors and three members who are not directors, appointed by the President with the approval of the Board, shall review the Bylaws, consider proposed amendments and report back to the Board sixty (60) days before the Annual Meeting.

Rationale: This brings the bylaws committee into conformity with the other Annual Meeting committees described in the bylaws.

ARTICLE XIV. AMENDMENTS. Section 1.d.

~~The Board of Directors may present amendments to the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws for adoption at a membership meeting provided:~~

- ~~1. Information and recommended language concerning the proposed changes has been sent to all Members at least two weeks prior to the Unit or membership meeting at which the change is to be discussed, and~~
- ~~2. Final action by the membership is taken at the next following membership meeting.~~

Rationale: Recommended by LWVC. Bylaws should only be amended at the Annual meeting. The rest of this Article explains how to amend the bylaws at the Annual Meeting.

RECOMMENDED CHANGES WITHOUT ANNUAL MEETING APPROVAL

Note: These are “housekeeping” changes that the Bylaws committee decided did not need to be voted approval at the Annual meeting. Any member delegate can challenge this decision:

- 1) Article III, Section 2b: Associate Members: All other Members shall be Associate Members, ~~who pay dues but~~ They may not vote and are not eligible to serve on the Board, on the nominating Committee nor as Delegates to any League Convention.
- 2) Article IV., Section 1: Change “Articles” to “Articles of Incorporation (hereinafter called Articles)
- 3) Article X, Section 1b: Add to the end of the section for clarification “of the nominating committee.”
- 4) Article X, Section 1d: The President of LWVSD shall send the name and contact information ~~address~~ of the Nominating Committee Chair to the Members.....
- 5) Article X, Section 4: ~~The election shall be in charge of an election Committee appointed by the President.~~ If required, an election committee shall be appointed by the President. The election shall be by ballot, except that if there is but one nominee for each office it shall be by voice vote, in which a majority vote of those local League Members present and qualified to vote and voting shall constitute an election.

NEW 50th YEAR LIFE MEMBERS

1. June Hass. June began with League in the early '50's in Wisconsin before moving to California in 1955 where she joined the San Mateo League. She has been with our League since 1985, living in Chula Vista and now in Rancho Bernardo, since February.
2. Janet Gilkeson. Janet has been in the League for 51 years, 6 in New Orleans, 25 in Claremont and Pomona, CA and 20 in LWVSD.
3. Maryolive Shoupe has been a member since, at least 1958, possibly earlier.
4. Joyce Tavrow began with the league in 1958 in Rochester, New York. In 1961 she was in Woodland ,CA then Palo Alto in 1962 - 63.
